About the Pipe Organ Encounter

This program is open to young people ages 13- 18 who have studied piano to the level of playing a Two-Part Invention by Bach, or similar level. They do not need to have studied organ. The Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) committee may choose to grant special consideration on an individual basis for admission of a potential registrant whose age or training is different from the guidelines.

Tuition includes housing, meals, transportation to and from all POE events during the week, admission to special events, class materials, lesson book (*Discovering the Organ* by Wayne Leupold), and a POE t-shirt. Participants will receive a one-year student membership in the American Guild of Organists. The cost of transportation to and from Kansas City, Missouri, is the student's responsibility.

An **Early Registration Fee** of \$375 is offered for applications postmarked on or before April 1, 2009. After that date, regular tuition will be \$425. No registrations will be accepted after June 1, 2009. If, for any reason, the registration needs to be cancelled, tuition will be partially refunded if notification is given on or before June 1, 2009. Registration is limited to 36 students.
